MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE ROWAN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS May 7, 2018 – 3:00 PM J. NEWTON COHEN, SR. ROOM J. NEWTON COUNTY ADMINISTRATION BUILDING

Present: Greg Edds, Chairman Jim Greene, Vice-Chairman Mike Caskey, Member Judy Klusman, Member Craig Pierce, Member

County Manager Aaron Church, Clerk to the Board/Assistant to the County Manager Carolyn Barger, County Attorney Jay Dees and Assistant County Manager/Finance Director Leslie Heidrick were present.

Chairman Edds convened the meeting at 3:00 p.m.

Chaplain Michael Taylor provided the Invocation.

Chairman Edds led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Edds recognized two (2) guests in the audience, whom he identified as Jane, and her son, Zack. Chairman Edds said Zack was attending the meeting as a Boy Scout requirement for a rank he was working towards. A round of applause followed the recognition.

CONSIDER ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA

Chairman Edds added a request to the Consent Agenda to set a public hearing for May 21, 2018 regarding an increase in the HOME Program funds. The issue was added as Consent Agenda item L.

CONSIDER DELETIONS FROM THE AGENDA

There were no deletions from the agenda.



CONSIDER APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Commissioner Klusman moved, Commissioner Greene seconded and the vote to approve both the agenda and Consent Agenda, as amended, passed unanimously.

CONSIDER APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

Commissioner Klusman moved, Commissioner Greene seconded and the vote to approve the minutes of the April 16, 2018 Commission Meeting passed unanimously.

2. PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

Chairman Edds opened the Public Comment Period and with no one wishing to address the Board. Chairman Edds closed the Public Comment Period.

3. ROWAN COUNTY ACCESS ROAD DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION – MCGILL ASSOCIATES TASK ORDER NO. 7

County Manager Aaron Church, along with Doug Chapman of McGill Associates (McGill), presented two (2) versions of task order #7 for the Rowan County Access Road Design and Construction (Project). Both versions of the task order included five (5) proposed phases.

The first version for the Project was for approximately 1,030 linear feet of industrial access road connecting Julian Road and extending to Corporate Center Drive to serve a private company and two (2) governmental facilities (Animal Shelter and new Recycling Center).



Total compensation was estimated not to exceed the lump sum amount of \$73,500.

The second version for the Project was for approximately 400 linear feet of industrial access road connecting to Julian Road and ending with a cul-de-sac, to serve a private company and two (2) governmental facilities (Animal Shelter and new Recycling Center).

Total compensation was estimated not to exceed the lump sum amount of \$48,800.

Commissioner Caskey referred to the first version and asked if there were concerns and any extra expense due to the wetlands. Mr. Chapman said there would be some permitting required as there was a stream and wetlands to be crossed. Commissioner Caskey asked if the costs could go even higher and Mr. Chapman felt unless something unusual occurred, the estimate was within the "ballpark."

In response to an inquiry from Commissioner Klusman pertaining to a specific area, Mr. Chapman said McGill had not looked at the soils to evaluate the area for future uses.

Mr. Church said if the Board chose the second option, it limited the Board to locate the recycling center to the land the County had just purchased. If the road was extended all the way through, the Recycling Center could be located behind the Animal Shelter.

Mr. Chapman cautioned the further back the Board goes with the construction of the Recycling Center, more grading would be required to level the ground for building.

Commissioner Klusman said she personally would like to see the Recycling Center located further back from Julian Road.

Chairman Edds favored locating the convenience site further back.

Assistant Planning Director Shane Stewart came forward to show a map of the proposed areas pertaining to each version of the task order.

Chairman Edds asked if relocating the Recycling Center would allow the Board to use funds from the Enterprise Fund to help pay for the road. Mr. Church responded in the affirmative.

Commissioner Pierce said it would be nice to have two (2) entrances into the convenience site. Commissioner Pierce also expressed concerns for the wetland area.



Commissioner Pierce said the cul-de-sac would limit the Board with regards to future expansion.

Commissioner Pierce made a motion to move forward with task order #7, option 1. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Greene and passed unanimously.

4. MCGILL ASSOCIATES, P.A. TASK ORDER #8 FOR PROPOSED I-85 INTERCHANGE WATER AND SEWER PLANNING SERVICES

County Manager Aaron Church and Doug Chapman with McGill Associates (McGill) discussed task order #8, which would authorize McGill to provide services for the Proposed I-85 Interchange Water and Sewer Service Planning Services (Project).

Mr. Church said the Project was for construction of water and sewer infrastructure to serve the proposed I-85 interchange, (along the new alignment of Old Beatty Ford Road) to be constructed by the North Carolina Department of Transportation (DOT). Mr. Church said the County would own the proposed infrastructure, which would connect to existing Salisbury/Rowan Utilities (SRU) infrastructure, and be maintained by SRU, through an interlocal agreement.

Mr. Church highlighted the scope of services as outlined in the agenda packet as Task 1 and Task 2. The County would pay McGill for the services in lump sum amounts as follows:

Task 1 – Interlocal Agreement Assistance \$14,000 Task 2 – Financial Analysis \$25,000

Mr. Chapman said the Board had previously discussed next steps. The next step is how to make the Project feasible, i.e. revenues and consumption of customers to make water/sewer work successfully. Mr. Chapman said limiting the financing to 10 years would probably not be feasible.

A handout from McGill was distributed to the Commissioners. The handout was the same handout from the Board's retreat which outlined the County's next steps concerning the I-85 South water and sewer infrastructure.

Commissioner Pierce moved to have McGill complete task order #8 for proposed I-85 Water and Sewer Plan Services, including an interlocal agreement and a financial model analysis. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Klusman and carried unanimously.

5. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF FSW 01-18

Assistant Planning Director Shane Stewart presented the staff report for FSW 01-18. Mr. Stewart said on October 2, 2000, the Board of Commissioners approved FSW 03-00 from Linda Barber to exceed the administrative limit of three (3) lots



plus the residual for family subdivisions on her property located at the 13100 block of Statesville Blvd. As a result, Ms. Barber created one (1) lot each for her daughters Brenda Barber (lot 2) and Sherry Dunlap (lot 3) and a third lot for her son Eric Barber (lot 4). A fourth lot was established for herself (lot 1) along with retaining the residual 9.2 acres labeled on the plat as "remainder."

Mr. Stewart reported Planning Staff met in March 2018 with Barber family members interested in purchasing lot 4, which was currently owned by Linda Barber's son, Charles Barber, along with the portion of land labeled as "remainder." According to the request from Charles, he would like to sell lot 4 to his cousin, William Junior Cherry, the nephew of Linda Barber (Magdeline Baker is Linda's sister and mother to William). According to Charles, Ms. Baker does not own land that could be given for him to build a home.

In 2016, the Commissioners amended the Subdivision Ordinance to specify family subdivision waivers could be used in two (2) instances: where lots would be conveyed to family members outside the definition of immediate family and for requests of more than four (4) total lots established. All other deviations are subject to the variance process before the Board of Adjustment.

Approving FSW 01-18 would allow the conveyance of lot 4 to a cousin of the current owner or nephew to the original owner (sub-divider).

As provided in Section 22-54, Mr. Stewart said the Board of Commissioners may authorize a waiver from the family subdivisions requirements when, in its opinion, undue hardship may result from strict compliance. Section 22-54 indicates the waiver shall only be granted when it has been determined that such waiver shall not be detrimental to the county and the areas surrounding the subdivision.

Chairman Edds opened the floor for the applicant to speak. Lynda Barber, wife of Charles Barber, said they would like for his cousin to be closer and was the reason for the request before the Board.

Commissioner Pierce moved, Commissioner Klusman seconded and the vote to approve FSW 01-18 passed unanimously.

6. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF BUDGET AMENDMENTS

Finance Director Leslie Heidrick presented the following budget amendments for the Board's consideration:

- Finance To transfer NC 911 revenue to contracted services \$79,332
- Social Services Revised expenditures/revenues based on Funding Authorizations received from the State. Funding Authorizations reflect the actual amount received and may increase/decrease the original budget estimate. DHHS has informed counties there will be no funding



- authorization for SSBG State funds. Instead, the funds have been added to the fund source for TANF transferred to SSBG. \$34,336
- Finance Budget additional revenues and expenditures for RTS contracted transportation services - \$20,000
- Social Services Move lapsed funds from available fund sources to cover expenditures within our Adoption and Foster Care programs. There was an increase in the number of children approved for adoption and custody continues to grow in foster care. Payments for both programs are mandated. \$308,500
- Health Department Appropriate restricted fund balance to cover travel expenditures for remainder of 2017-18 - \$3,800
- Fund 201 Fire Districts Increase budget to cover fire districts' tax turnover for rest of fiscal year - \$284,000

Commissioner Pierce moved approval of the budget amendments as presented. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Klusman and passed unanimously.

7. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF BOARD APPOINTMENTS HOUSING AUTHORITY BOARD

Doug Jones resigned from the Rowan County Housing Authority Board and the following applications were received to fill Mr. Jones' vacancy, which expires August 31, 2018:

- Gary Eugene Yelton
- Christian Wilson

The appointee would fulfill the remainder of Mr. Jones' term, after which he would be eligible for reappointment for a 5 year term.

Commissioner Pierce moved to appoint Gary Yelton. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Klusman and passed unanimously.

FRANKLIN VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

There are 3 vacancies for the Franklin Volunteer Fire Department and the following applications were received:

- Robert Connor (Eligible for reappointment)
- Spencer Lane (Eligible for reappointment)
- Raymond Mark Sokolowski

The appointments will be for a 2-year term date beginning May 7, 2018, and expiring April 30, 2020.

Commissioner Klusman moved to reappoint Robert Connor and Spencer Lane and to appoint Mark Sokolowski. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Pierce and passed unanimously.



8. ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business to come before the Board, Commissioner Pierce moved to adjourn at 3:33 p.m. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Klusman and passed unanimously.

Beds are provided free to caregivers who receive no funding assistance, maintaining the child with the birth family, preventing the child from foster care placement, thus strengthening the family and community.

ROCOC is a partnership between RCDSS,72 Rowan County churches, citizens, and community partners that assist children and teenagers from birth through age 21. The children are victims of abuse, neglect, or dependency who are actively receiving Child Protective or Foster Care Services from RCDSS.

ROCOC unites RCDSS, the faith community, foundations, citizens, businesses and community partners seeking to improve the lives of children and teenagers, who are experiencing trauma due to being victims of neglect or abuse. These entities donate financial gifts and provide grant funds to the RCDSS ROCOC Assistance Fund. Donated funds are managed by DSS and Rowan County Government Finance offices. 100% of funds are used for client assistance. Families may receive no more than \$650 in assistance. Social Workers must request assistance for a family through a case history referral form. Requests are screened, approved or denied by the ROCOC Program Coordinator and the Supervisor. The social worker or the family sign a receipt indicating receipt of the purchased items.

ROCOC has an Assistance Center at Main Street United Methodist Church in Salisbury, North Carolina. Clients upon receiving a referral from their social worker, can come and receive life essential items. The Center is staffed by volunteers except for the ROCOC Program Coordinator who is a paid by RCDSS.

From January 2007 to December 31, 2017, assistance has been given to children, teenagers and families, 15,085 times. Purchases of life essential items rose from 365 in 2015 to 472 in 2016. This represents a 23% increase from the previous year. Life necessity purchases rose form 472 in 2016 to 550 in 2017, representing a 16.53% increase.

The most significant need continues to be beds for children and teenagers. In 2015, 59% of expenditures were spent on bed purchases. In 2016, 58.14% of total expenditures were spent on bed purchases. Bed purchase cost increased by 34% from 2015 to 2016, from \$15,073.22 to \$23,130.78.

Bed cost in 2017 were \$29,229.12. This is a 26.36% increase from 2016. Bed cost represented 60.98 % of 2017 total expenditures.

The project is led by Rev. Jon Hunter, the ROCOC Program Coordinator. Rev. Hunter has 18 years of service with RCDSS and has served as a pastor for 35 years. Rev. Hunter has a proven track record: recruiting new member congregations; maintaining the participation of member congregations; and increasing financial and material good donations from member congregations, community partners and local foundations.

The Program has won Best Practice Awards from the National One Church One Child Program and from the North Carolina Division of Social Services.

REQUEST

Steve and Vicki Southerland are requesting a conditional use permit to accommodate a 1,200 sq.ft. residential storage facility on Tax parcel 606 047. The proposed structure would be located on the parcel in which they plan to construct their house at a later date, and used to store personal items and equipment during the construction of their home.

CONDITIONAL USE **REQUIREMENTS**

Section 21-60 (10) of the Zoning Ordinance indicates residential storage facilities are subject to the following standards (staff comments in bold text):

- **a.** The parcel shall be in fee simple ownership. Yes, owned exclusively by Steve and Vicki Southerland.
- b. The structure shall be of compatible construction with surrounding area. The applicant proposes a metal building, which is a façade common to most areas of the county.
- c. The maximum size allowed is three thousand (3,000) square feet. The proposed building totals 1,200 sq.ft.
- d. No outdoor storage is allowed except as specifically provided otherwise. None proposed.

- **e.** Minimum lot size shall be the same as for a single-family residence. Lot size is 2.48 acres vs. minimum lot size of .46 acres (20,000 sq.ft.).
- **f.** Storage of vehicles shall not be in the front yard. None proposed.
- g. Outside lighting shall be designed to prevent direct glare on adjoining residences. None proposed.
- **h. Setbacks shall be at a minimum the same as single family dwellings.** The proposed structure complies with the required 50' front, 10' side, and 20' rear setback.

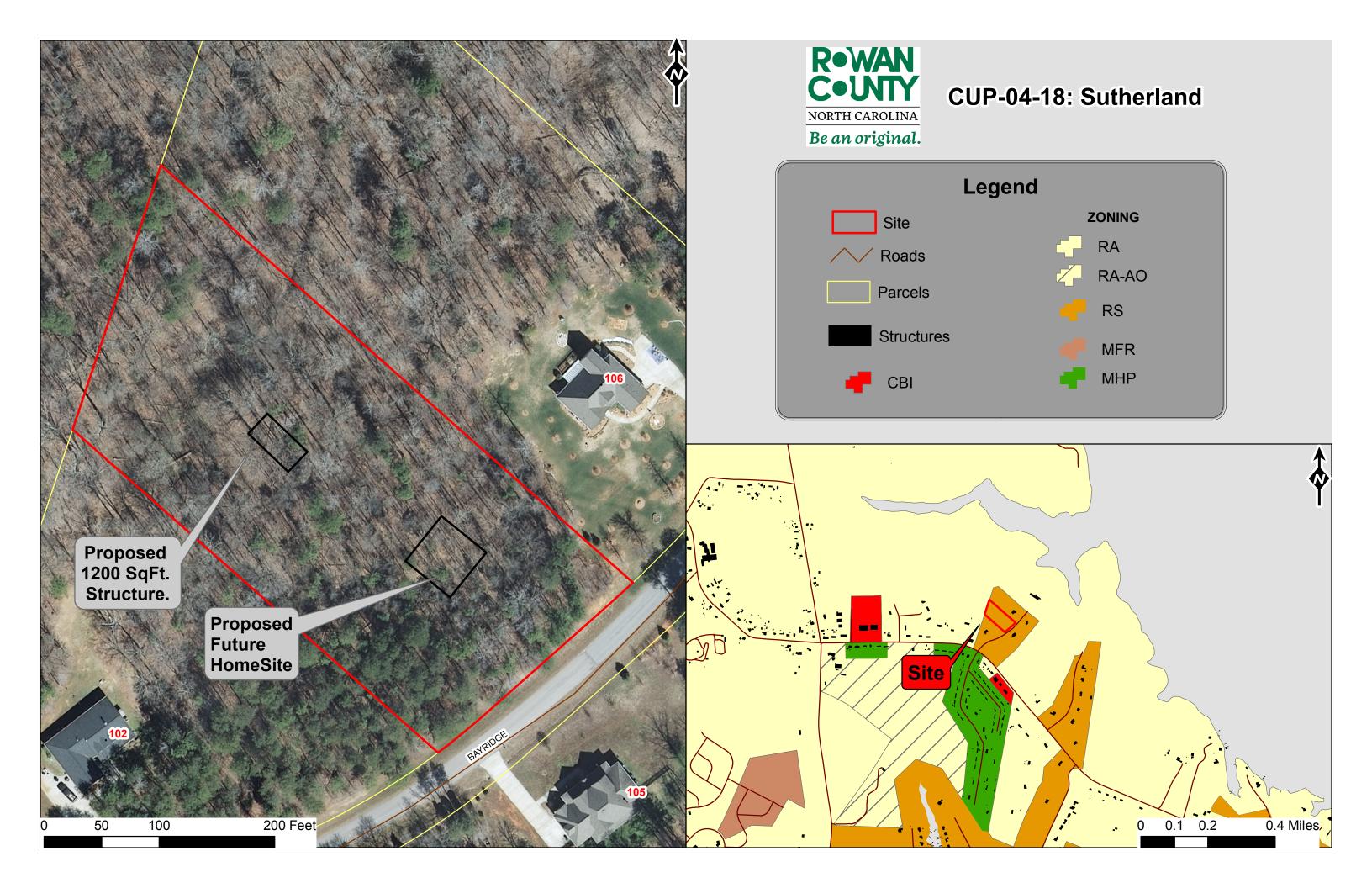
EVALUATION CRITERIA

As provided in Section 21-59, the applicant has provided responses to the evaluation criteria with staff comments indicated below.

- **1. Adequate transportation access to the site exists.** The structure would be accessible from Bayridge Dr. SR 2282.
- 2. The use will not significantly detract from the character of the surrounding area. The proposed structure will be under both the allowed 3,000 sq.ft. limit for residential storage facilities and the 10% limit for accessory structures on residentially developed lots (10,803 sq.ft.).
- **3. Hazardous safety conditions will not result.** No hazardous safety conditions are envisioned based on the proposed use.
- **4.** The use will not generate significant noise, odor, glare, or dust. Any associated impacts would be similar to that found on properties containing a residence.
- **5.** Excessive traffic or parking problems will not result. N/A.
- 6. The use will not create significant visual impacts for adjoining properties or passersby. Based on the submitted site plan the structure will be over 200 feet from the road and over 200 feet from the closest residence.

The 5310 grant has a one year period of performance which is July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019. RTS intends to utilize contract revenue from user agencies and State operating funds for match.

Approve the County Manager as the "authorized official" to make the necessary federal & state assurances and certifications on application documents with empowerment to enter into subsequent transportation grant agreements. The County Attorney must also affirm that Rowan County has authority under Federal, State and local law to make and comply with certifications and assurances.

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

This Interlocal Agreement ("Agreement") is made this the day of, 2018, by
and between the County of Rowan, ("County"), a North Carolina body politic and the Rowan
County Tourism Development Authority ("TDA"), a North Carolina Public Authority, as
follows:

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, the TDA is the owner of the Fisher Thompson Hardware Warehouse, storage structure built in the 1920s which is located on Kerr Street between North Lee Street and Depot Street;

WHEREAS, the TDA did acquire the Fisher Thompson Hardware Warehouse for the purpose of creating a dynamic outdoor venue and to improve access to existing and future tourism businesses in the Railwalk District of Salisbury's Central Business District;

WHEREAS, the TDA seeks to repurpose the Fisher Thompson Hardware Warehouse through certain demolition and new construction activities to facilitate improved vehicular and pedestrian access in the Railwalk District thereby increasing access and economic growth to current and future businesses and to further provide for a new dynamic outdoor venue for concerts, markets, performances and events to drive additional visitor spending (hereinafter the "Construction Project");

WHEREAS, the continued economic growth and tourism development of the current and future businesses in the Railwalk District is in the mutual interests of the parties hereto; and

WHEREAS, the County supports the effort to increase economic growth and tourism development in and through enhancements to the Railwalk District and its infrastructure, including TDA's undertaking of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the TDA has procured, through and in compliance with North Carolina General Statutes and open public bidding requirements, a bid of Three Hundred Eighty-One Thousand Ninety-Five Dollars and No Cents (\$381,095.00) from the lowest qualified bidder, R&L Glover, a Salisbury, North Carolina based commercial contractor ("Contractor") to complete the Construction Project pursuant to and consistent with renovation plans approved by the City of Salisbury Historic Preservation Commission attached hereto as Exhibit A,;

WHEREAS, The TDA, as a "unit of local government" as that term is defined in NCGS 460A-460(2) is authorized to enter into Interlocal Agreements for the purposes expressed herein pursuant to NCGS 160A-461, including further authorization to enter into binding multi-year contracts or agreement pursuant to NCGS 159-13; and

WHEREAS, TDA desires to obtain from the County and the County desires to provide to the TDA, certain funds to facilitate the Construction Project as an Interlocal Agreement for repurposing of the Fisher Thompson Hardware Warehouse and generating the anticipated economic growth and tourism development referenced hereinabove;

NOW WHEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises contained herein the parties hereto agrees as follows:

- County and the TDA each represent to the other that it has received the appropriate
 approvals of its respective board and that by signing below each is authorized to enter
 into this Interlocal Agreement and the same shall be valid and binding on each of
 them.
- 2. The County shall expend up to a maximum amount of Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$350,000.00) for approved expenses related to the Construction Project.
- 3. The TDA shall submit to the County qualified invoices received and approved by the TDA from the Contractor for work completed or materials purchased specifically related to and consistent with the plans for the Construction Project, and the County shall remit payments directly to the Contractor.
- 4. Any and all costs of the Construction Project exceeding Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$350,000.00) shall be the exclusive responsibility of the TDA. The TDA hereby assures County and represents and warrants that it has sufficient funds on hand, restricted or otherwise, to complete the Construction Project to the extent the Construction Project exceeds the amount paid by County herein.
- 5. It is understood and agreed that the TDA shall begin submitting invoices to the County for reimbursement upon commencement of the Construction Project and upon periodic receipt of invoices from the Contractor which the parties anticipate will be prior to the end of Fiscal Year 2017-2018.
- 6. The TDA shall reimburse the County all funds paid by County herein above, in five (5) equal annual installments commencing in Fiscal Year 2018-2019. Each payment due herein shall be due on or before May 1 of each fiscal year.

7. Responsibilities of the Parties:

- A. County shall pay all qualified invoices within fifteen (15) days of receipt from TDA, provided the County has received such properly executed invoices together with any and all required supporting documentation required by the County to verify the invoiced amounts.
- B. TDA shall enter in its name into all contracts and agreements for services and construction related to the Construction Project to advance the goals and objectives of this Agreement.

- C. TDA shall give County reasonable time and opportunity to review plans and costs of the Construction Project.
- D. TDA shall insure compliance of its Contractors with Article 2 Chapter 64 of the North Carolina General Statutes.
- E. TDA will require its Contractors and Professional Service Providers to maintain and provide certificates of coverage for the following insurance coverage:
 - 1. Commercial General Liability with minimum coverage of \$1,000,000.00 property and bodily injury;
 - 2. Workers Compensation with minimum coverage per accident that is consistent with North Carolina General Statutes;
 - 3. Commercial Automobile Liability with minimum coverage of \$1,000,000.00 bodily injury for each person, each accident, and \$1,000,000.00 property damage, or \$1,000,000.00 combined single limit each occurrence/aggregate; and
 - 4. Professional Liability insurance under such terms as the County and TDA shall mutually agree.
- 8. County, during the term hereof and for two (2) years after completion of the Construction Project, shall have the right to audit, either itself or through an independent auditor at County's expense, all books and records related to the Construction Project to evaluate compliance with Terms and Conditions hereof.
- 9. Either Party may terminate this Agreement for breach of its terms by the other Party provided the non-breaching Party has provided notice of such breach and the breach remains uncured for more than ten (10) days or a reasonable longer time consistent with time needed to cure the breach.

- 11. This is the entire Agreement between the Parties, and the same may be executed in multiple originals. Any amendments to this Agreement must be in writing and approved by each Party's respective Boards.
- 12. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of North Carolina and venue for any and all actions arising out of this Agreement shall be Rowan County, North Carolina.

- 13. No delay or omission by either Party to exercise any right or power it has under this Agreement shall impair or be construed as a waiver of such right or power, nor shall any such omission or waiver of a covenant or breach operate as a waiver of any succeeding breach.
- 14. The invalidity of one or more of the provisions contained herein shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Agreement so long as the material purposes of this Agreement can be determined and effectuated.

- The OWNER hereby agrees to pay to the Contractor for the faithful performance of this agreement, subject to additions and deductions a provided in the specifications or proposal, in lawful money of the United States, such unit and/or lump sum prices as are set forth in the accepted proposal for quantities of each item actually accomplished.

The OWNER shall make partial payments to the Contractor on a basis of a duly certified and approved estimate of work performed during the preceding calendar month by the Contractor within twenty (20) calendar days after receipt of a correct payment request, less ten percent (10%) of the amount of such estimate which is to be retained by the OWNER until all work has been performed strictly in accordance with this Contract and until such work has been accepted by the OWNER.
- 5. Neither final payment nor any remaining retained percentage shall become due <u>until</u> <u>thirty (30) days</u> after all the following have occurred:

BACKGROUND

On September 2, 1999, Planning Staff issued a zoning permit to property owners Paul and Kathy Beckham for a 4,600 sq.ft. personal use storage building (not for business) located at 11710

Bringle Ferry Road on tax parcel 507-039. To knowledge, no other permit requests were made regarding this site until January of 2011 when a contractor working for current property owner JEMM LLC. requested permits from the Environmental Health Office to install a new septic system. After learning JEMM's intensions of signing a lease agreement with Charles Blackwelder to operate a metal recycling facility, staff informed the owner the property would need to be rezoned to Industrial (IND) with a conditional use permit prior to operation.

In researching the site's history, it was discovered from Tax Assessors Office records, the Beckham's operated P&K mobile wash & equipment rental in late 1999 / early 2000. Since they lived on an adjacent parcel, this business may have met the Special Requirements (SR) to allow the operation but was permitted by both Staff and the Building Inspections Office as residential storage only. It is unknown what the building was used for between 2000 and 2011.

On May 2, 2011, the Board of Commissioners (BOC) approved the rezoning of tax parcel 507-039, totaling approximately 10 acres, from Rural Agricultural (**RA**) to Industrial with a Conditional Use District **IND-CUD** to accommodate a metal recycling facility.

REQUEST

Mr. Blackwelder ceased operation around the spring of 2014 leaving the property idle until sometime in 2017. Initially, JEMM requested a modification to the existing **IND-CUD** district, which permitted only

metal recycling, to **IND-CD** to permit a commercial fabricator of acrylic countertops, which is currently in operation. However, as a result of the Planning Board (PB) meeting both the owner and applicant elected to amend the request to Neighborhood Business (**NB**) instead of a modified **IND** district. With this change, all uses in district must be considered when evaluating this designation.

ZONING CRITERIA

1. Relationship and conformity with any plans and policies.

Plans – This property is located in Area Two identified by the Land Use Plan for Areas East of I-85, which references instances of rural commercial and industrial uses that operate along thoroughfares. Neighborhood Business is generally considered an appropriate designation for "Rural Business" located along identified thoroughfares such as Bringle Ferry Road (major thoroughfare). Transitioning to **NB** could address plan recommendation "B" noted on page 27 of the plan, "Industrial land use applications are discouraged in the Planning Area except for existing industrial districts and those properties within the US 29 / I-85 and NC 152 highway corridors." It is worth noting, the initial rezoning in 2011 preceded the east plan adoption by eight (8) months.

Policies – N/A.

2. Consistency with the requested zoning district's purpose and intent.

Industrial, IND – "This district is intended to provide for industrial activities involving extraction, manufacturing, processing, assembling, storage, and distribution of products. The district is also designed to accommodate other, more intense nonresidential uses which generate adverse side effects such as noise, odor or dust. The district is typically applied in areas with maximum accessibility to major highways, rail lines, and other significant transportation systems. However this district may also exist or be created in an area other than listed in this subsection if the existing or proposed development is compatible with the surrounding area and the overall public good is served."

Neighborhood Business, NB – This district is designed for retail, limited small manufacturing facilities and service oriented business centers which serve small trading areas. As a result the list of allowed uses is more limited than those in the CBI district. The development standards for these business areas are designed to promote sound, permanent business development and to protect abutting and surrounding residential areas from undesirable aspects of nearby commercial development. This district is also designed to provide opportunities for potential development within the NB district.

Areas zoned NB shall be so located as to conveniently serve the community population. The establishment and subsequent development of this district shall not create or expand problems associated with traffic volumes or circulation. As the district is established to

provide for small neighborhood oriented business areas limitations on gross floor area is established. Limitations on total impervious surface are established to minimize the adverse impacts of this type of development on adjacent residential areas. Generally, the NB district shall be two (2) acres or larger. However a lot of record, smaller than two (2) acres may be considered for rezoning to NB if the owner of the lot does not own adjacent property which may be included in the rezoning request.

Considering the land use plan recommendations, **NB** seems appropriate for the subject property. Migrating from **IND** would not only eliminate scrap metal recycling as a possible land use but would also remove the notion this area could be considered "industrial" should future landowners in the vicinity consider similar zone changes.

3. Compatibility of all uses within the proposed district classification with other properties and conditions in the vicinity.

<u>Compatibility of uses</u> – For comparison purposes, the below table of use excerpt provides a generalized comparison between the **IND-CUD** and **NB** districts.

Nearly all uses in the NB district are subject to the following standards:

- 1. Building size is limited to the lesser of 10% of the lot size or 10,000 sq.ft.
- 2. Maximum impervious surface shall not exceed sixty-five (65) percent of the lot.
- 3. Hours of operation shall not exceed 6:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.
- 4. Outdoor storage sited to the rear of the building, not within the setbacks, and completely screened from adjacent residentially zoned property.
- 5. Outdoor display limited to 2,500 sq.ft.

These limitations are designed to reduce potential impacts on adjoining properties and address compatibility in **NB** designations in rural locations.

Conditions in the vicinity (see enclosed map) –

Residential density is very low in the immediate area as most of the surrounding **RA** zoned acreage contains a thick coverage of evergreen and deciduous trees. The nearest **IND** zone is located 1.2 road miles west of this site containing a 9,800 sq.ft. race shop constructed in 1996 (pre-zoning) within the 5 ½ acre district. The Kountry Market, located 1.3 road miles east of from the site, represents the only other non-residential district within the vicinity. The five (5) acre **CBI-CUD** district contains a 4,000 sq.ft. convenience store constructed in 1945. Two (2) additional non-residential non-conforming structures, currently zoned RA, are located adjacent to the convenient store: a 900 sq.ft retail store constructed in 1952 and a 1,500 retail store constructed in 1977 (according to the Assessors Office Records).

4. Potential impact on facilities such as roads, utilities and schools.

<u>Roads</u> – DOT traffic counts from 2016 received 800 feet east of the intersection of Surratt Road suggests an average daily traffic count of 1,300 trips per day compared to an estimated capacity of 15,100 trips by the DOT Comprehensive Transportation Plan for this section of Bringle Ferry Road. Since the estimated capacity is largely based on pavement width and speed limit, it should only be used as basic information regarding the volume to capacity ratio rather than the single measure in assessing the road's operational capability.

<u>Utilities & Schools – N/A.</u>

DECISION MAKING

In addition to the above criteria, sec. 21-362 (c) of the Zoning Ordinance indicates the primary question before the PB / BOC in a rezoning decision is "whether the proposed"

change advances the public health, safety, or welfare as well as the intent and spirit of the ordinance." Additionally, the boards "shall not regard as controlling any advantages or disadvantages to the individual requesting the change but shall consider the impact of the proposed zoning change on the public at large."

PROCEDURES

The BOC must develop a statement of consistency describing whether its action is consistent with any adopted comprehensive plans and indicate why their action is reasonable and in the public

interest [sec. 21-362 (j)]. A statement analyzing the reasonableness of the decision is also necessary. Recent adoption of Senate Bill 131 established a structured statement of consistency required for each zoning map and text amendment, which must take one of the following forms:

1. A statement approving the zoning amendment and describing its consistency with an adopted comprehensive plan and explaining why the action taken is reasonable and in the public interest;

- 2. A statement rejecting the zoning amendment and describing its inconsistency with an adopted comprehensive plan and explaining why the action taken is reasonable and in the public interest;
- 3. A statement approving the zoning amendment and containing at least all of the following:
 - a. A declaration that the approval is also deemed an amendment to the comprehensive plan;
 - b. An explanation of the change in conditions the board took into account amending the zoning ordinance to meet the development needs of the community;
 - c. Why the action was reasonable and in the public interest.

While no other specific guides were established to direct required content, guidance from the UNC School of Government suggests the "statements must be more than a checklist conclusion – it must include some modest discussion and explanation".

MARCH 26TH PLANNING BOARD MEETING

Other than the applicant, no one was present at the courtesy hearing. PB members

discussed the benefits of recommending NB to the applicant and BOC vs. leaving the conditional district and IND designation. On a vote of 8-1, the board recommended approval of the request but recommended staff work with the applicant to modify the request to NB.

The PB recommended the following statements, which were based on the conditional district request, and will need to be modified if approved as Neighborhood Business. Staff included alternative statements for NB designation for consideration.

<u>Consistency</u> - In accordance with section 21-361(b) of the Rowan County Zoning Ordinance, the Planning Board advises the Z 02-18 request is consistent with the Eastern Rowan Land Use Plan based on the following: The new use is a modification and improvement to the current IND-CUD district and removes the allowed use of metal recycling. The use of acrylic countertop fabrication is a more compatible less intrusive use. The request utilizes performance based standards to a single use to ensure compatibility with other uses.

Staff suggested statement - In accordance with section 21-361(b) of the Rowan County Zoning Ordinance, the Z 02-18 request is consistent with the Eastern Rowan Land Use Plan based on the following: Neighborhood Business is considered an appropriate designation for rural business along thoroughfares such as Bringle Ferry Road; and transitioning from Industrial to Neighborhood Business would address plan recommendation "B", which discourages Industrial land use applications outside specified corridors.

<u>Reasonableness</u> - In accordance with section 21-362(j) of the Rowan County Zoning Ordinance and after due consideration advises the Z 02-18 request is reasonable with the Eastern Land Use Plan and in the public interest based on the following: The request is an improvement of the existing IND-CUD zoning district. The request is a reuse of an existing commercial structure.

Staff suggested statement - In accordance with section 21-362(j) of the Rowan County Zoning Ordinance after due consideration, the Z 02-18 request is reasonable and in the public interest based on the following: Neighborhood Business is the recommended district for rural businesses along thoroughfares; the district contains a list of special requirements designed to reduce potential impact on adjoining properties and address compatibility in rural locations; the list of uses allowed with special requirements in NB as compared to the RA district, which is the predominant zoning district in the area, are nearly identical; this request will allow the reuse of an existing commercial structure and remove metal recycling as an allowed use.

STAFF COMMENTS

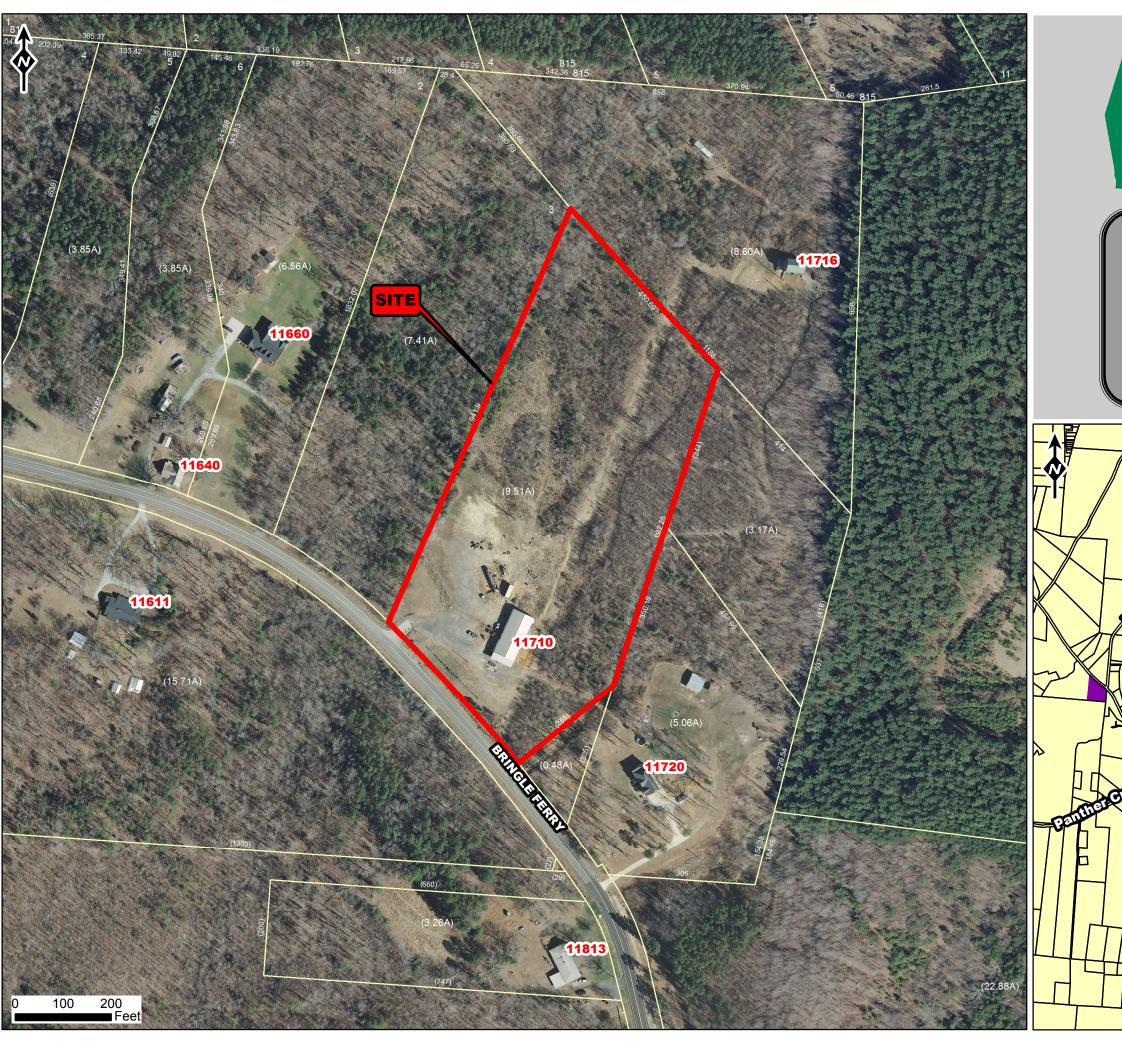
This request would modify an existing **IND-CUD** district to exclude metal recycling in favor of a district recommended by the eastern plan that could also serve as a practical

district for future uses should the current cease operation. Exchanging **IND** for **NB** would also remove any notion adjacent properties could be prime for industrial rezoning.

Of the current conditions for the conditional district, it appears only condition #3 and 4 could be lost as the others have either already been satisfied or no longer apply.

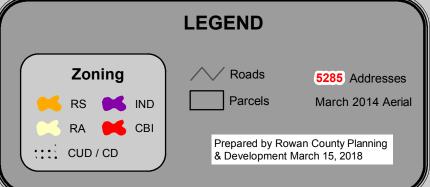
Current conditions of approval from the previous request are as follows:

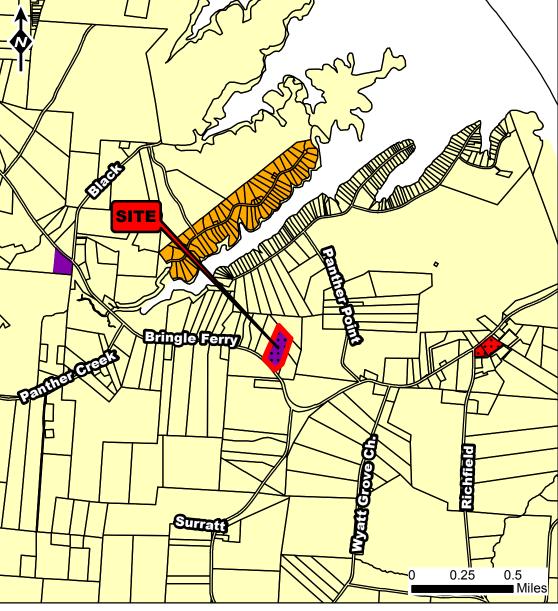
- 1) Pave the driveway 50 feet.
- 2) Obtain and comply with commercial driveway permit from DOT.
- 3) Provide a type A buffer [along the property frontage].
- 4) Limit the operation to the front half of the property.
- 5) Comply with the change of use requirements from the Building Inspections Office.
- 6) All metal must be store in containers or within the existing building.
- 7) Any non-metal materials removed from items purchased must be disposed within an appropriate container, dumpster, or within the building and not stockpiled on the ground.
- 8) Add gravel around the outside storage container area.
- 9) Provide necessary measures to obtain a "no exposure exemption" from NCDENR's Industrial Stormwater Permit.

BACKGROUND

After speaking with Rowan County Environmental Management Staff regarding the need to locate a new convenience site for solid waste and recycling in the southwestern portion of the

county, Planning Staff noted these operations would be classified as *Local Trucking without Storage* (SIC 4212) permitted with Special Requirements in the **NB** district and by right in **CBI** and **IND** districts. Considering other essential services such as police, fire, ambulance, and rescue are permitted by right in all zoning districts and the Board of Commissioners (BOC) would make the final determination of site selection with any new operation, staff is of the opinion these locations should not be restricted to non-residential zones only.

PROPOSED CHANGES

New text appear as bold red text.

AMENDMENTS TO CHAPTER 21: ZONING ORDINANCE

Solid Waste and Recycling Convenience Center means a facility operated by Rowan County for the purpose of fulfilling its solid waste and recycling service responsibilities to the public defined in NCGS 130A-309.09A. Convenience centers typically include a structure(s) for administrative operations (personnel, storage, etc.) and an arrangement of mobile containers used to collect and store local solid waste and assorted recyclables until transported to an off-site location for disposal and / or processing. These facilities may also accommodate the temporary and incidental storage of collected bulky or oversized materials along with miscellaneous other materials outside of containers.

PROCEDURES

The BOC must develop a statement of consistency describing whether its action is consistent with any adopted comprehensive plans and indicate why their

action is reasonable and in the public interest [sec. 21-362 (j)]. Due to recent changes in the statutes, the proposed consistency statement below contains the appropriate structure based on the statute options given, which should be retained in the event of potential modification by the BOC.

MARCH 26TH PLANNING BOARD MEETING

While the board was generally in favor of the proposed text

amendment, some members suggested a public hearing process should be included to receive input on siting a new facility at least in residentially zoned areas. On a vote of 5-4, the board voted to adopt the proposed text amendment and with the recommendation of including a public hearing based on the following statement of consistency:

Staff Comments

Planning staff worked with Environmental Management Director Caleb Sinclair to develop an appropriate definition.

Since the BOC is involved in site selection, a conditional use permit would be unnecessary. Consistency – "**ZTA-01-18** is appropriate and necessary to meet the development needs of Rowan County for the following reasons not previously envisioned by the Eastern and Western Land Use Plans: Solid Waste and Recycling Convenience Centers need to be permitted in residential zoning districts to avoid spot zoning. Furthermore the adoption of ZTA 01-18 is deemed an amendment to the Eastern and Western Land Use Plans and is reasonable and in the public interest based on the following: Solid Waste and Recycling Convenience Centers need to be located near residential areas".

STAFF COMMENTS

Due to limited commercial zoning in many portions of the county, it seems most reasonable to allow these uses in all zoning districts by right similar to the essential

services mentioned. Should the BOC wish to include a hearing as part of the zoning process, staff would need to further amend the proposed ordinance to accommodate. Alternatively, the BOC may, at their discretion, have a policy to receive public input separate from a zoning process.

HOME Application

The County conducted its required hearing notifying the public of its intent to submit an application with the Cabarrus / Iredell / Rowan HOME Program on March 19, 2018 and filed the related application with the City of Concord on March 20, 2018. The County anticipated receiving \$147,366 in project funds and proposed to contribute \$36,842 in cash contribution as the required 25% match for program participation.

Last week, Staff was notified by the HOME Consortium's Program Manager that Rowan County would be receiving an increase in funds totaling \$204,371; likewise, the County's match contribution would increase to \$51,092. Given the increase is >25% of the original amount advertised, the regional HUD representative advises a new public hearing is necessary. From a budget perspective, the Finance Director indicated this increase can be accommodated in the FY 18-19 budget planning process.

The scope of the FY 18-19 program will not change and will concentrate on owner-occupied housing rehabilitation.

- Conduct Public Hearing regarding the increase in HOME Program funds
- Authorize County Manager to sign updated HOME Application (if necessary)
- Budget required match for HOME Program participation in FY 18-19 budget to accommodate the funding increase

The Rowan County HOME Program will provide rehabilitation assistance for four (4) homes of individuals who receive 80% or less of the area median family income.

Rowan County will use the 2018-19 HOME funding allocation to provide housing rehabilitation to four (4) households within the County limits for individuals/families who are 80% or less of the median area income. Projects will be located in the non-entitlement areas of Rowan County. The entitlement areas are defined as the city limits of both the City of Salisbury and the City of Kannapolis. Rowan County has contracted with Salisbury Community Development Corporation (Salisbury CDC) in Salisbury, North Carolina, to administer the 2018-19 HOME Program.

Rehabilitation Project

Through rehabilitation assistance, the County will create suitable living environments for low to moderate income county homeowners and provide increased affordability for these households. To accomplish this goal, we will provide energy efficient improvements and limit some long term maintenance of their homes through the comprehensive improvements provided. All Rowan County homeowners, who live in the non-entitlement areas of the County will be encouraged to apply for assistance without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, national origin or handicap. Applicants must meet program and HUD income guidelines to be eligible.

Qualified owner-occupied family units will be inspected; a work write up and cost estimate will be prepared, which will include energy and water efficient products where applicable and contractors will be invited to bid on the designated work. Rehabilitation contracts will be awarded to lowest qualified contractor. Section 8 contractors and women/minority owned contractors will be encouraged to bid on rehabilitation projects. Homes built prior to 1978 will have lead-based testing done with only certified lead abatement contractors providing lead removal or abatement.

The funding is provided by the County as a grant at zero percent interest (0%) which will be forgiven at a rate of 20% per year beginning the 61st month after work is completed. The homeowner may not sell, refinance, rent or change the ownership status of the home until the grant is forgiven unless repayment of the remaining balance is made.
